

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the difference between B.Ed and B.El.Ed?
B.Ed is a one year course taken up after graduation whereas B.El.Ed is a four year integrated course pursued after Class XII and leads to a graduation degree.
2. Can boys apply for this course?
Currently the course is for girls only
3. Are the forms available at all branches of SBI?
The prospectus and forms are available only at the following six branches of SBI:
 - 1) North Campus Delhi University
 - 2) Gargi College
 - 3) Shahdara;
 - 4) Prashant Vihar;
 - 5) Sector 11 Dwarka;
 - 6) B-Block Connaught Place
4. Where can I submit the form?
At any of the three centres:
 - a. Gargi college, Sri fort road
 - b. SPM College Punjabi Bagh
 - c. CIE, Department of Education, University of Delhi
5. Do I have to attach a bank draft with my application?
Only if you had asked the application by post. In this case you need to retain a copy of the bank draft and put the relevant information in the application form and the ICR form
6. What is the minimum age requirement?
You should have completed 17 on or before July 15, 2011. There is no age relaxation
7. I am from commerce background. Can I apply?
Yes you can, but please make sure you have the right combination of subjects i.e. you can opt any one out of Business Studies and Accountancy. In other word, if you have both Business Studies and Accountancy select the one with higher marks under B-13. Remember, both of these cannot be selected.
8. I have Computer science/ Information Practice / Indian music / Physical Education as one of my subjects in class XII. Will the marks of these subjects be considered while applying for B.El.Ed?
Yes, you can opt for these subjects under List C. In such cases ensure that you have:
 - a. Any one language: English or Hindi (List A)
 - b. At least two subjects from List B (refer prospectus)
 - c. The subjects that you have mentioned will come as your fourth choice i.e. under List C
9. I have Sanskrit/ Regional Language. How do I choose my options?
 - a. You must choose any one language either English or Hindi. This is compulsory and will come under List A

- b. Any other language like Sanskrit or a Regional Language will come under List B i.e B-01.

For example, Case 1) for English Core and Sanskrit: Mark A-01 and B-01

Case 2) For Hindi and Regional Language: select A-02 and B-01

Case 3) for English Core and Hindi B: You must choose the one with higher marks as A-01

10. How can I prepare for the course?

Revisit your concepts till class X level.

There will be four sections in the test:

- a. Bilingual comprehension
- b. Mathematical reasoning
- c. Concepts of science
- d. Concepts of social sciences

11. Is there negative marking in the test?

No, there is no negative marking. However, there are sectional cut-offs so you must answer all sections.

12. What is the medium of B.El.Ed course?

B.El.Ed is a bilingual course. It is taught in both English and Hindi medium.

13. Do I have to do B.Ed after B.El.Ed?

No, you don't

14. How will I come to know my rank?

Your rank (both in general list and in your category list) will be displayed on the CIE website <http://cie.du.ac.in> and in the Department of Education on Tuesday July 05,2011.

15. Where can I do this course from?

16. What all should one consider when deciding the college?

The short listed candidates will be called for Centralized Counselling according to their merit.

When making a choice you must consider

- a) Liberal option that you would wish to pursue in second and third year
- b) Distance of the college from your house
- c) Fee structure
- d) Hostel facilities, if you need one

17. How long will the test be?

The duration of the test is three hours. You must reach the centre by 9:30 am

18. Can I do post graduation after this course?

Yes you can

19. Can I appear for Civil services after this course?

Yes, you can

20. I have done my class XII from NIOS. Can I apply?

Ofcourse, you can

21. Suggest some reading material that may help me prepare for the Entrance exam?

We do not recommend any special books for preparation. You may revisit the concepts till class X level. You may also refer to last year's question paper for reference on the nature of questions asked in the test. This is available on <http://cie.du.ac.in>

22. How will I come to know my test centre?

Your admit card will be sent to you by post. It will also be available of the website <http://cie.du.ac.in> . If you do not receive your admit card by June 23, 2011 you may get a duplicate one from the Department of Education on June 24, 2011 before 4:00 pm. Do get your acknowledgement card for issuing a duplicate admit card.

23. I am an OBC category candidate. How will I come to know whether I will be considered for reservation or not?

OBC candidates shall be considered eligible if the final marks listed for such candidate are not more than 10% lower than the final marks scored by the last candidate admitted to the general category.

Only the OBCs listed in the Central List of OBCs shall be considered for admission under the OBC category. The OBC certificate should mention that the candidate belongs to "Non Creamy layer" in order to be considered under the OBC category.
